Federal Budget FFY 2024

- President Biden signed the \$1.2 billion federal spending package on March 23, 2024:
 - \$8.75 billion for the Child Care and Development Block Grant (\$725 million increase)
 - \$12.27 billion for Head Start (\$250 million increase)
 - Funding for vital programs for families & children remain essentially flat



Child Care Development Fund (CCDF) Final Rule 2024

CA must

- Pay child care providers in advance of or at the beginning of child care services
- Pay child care providers based on enrollment
- CCDF encourages states to "delink" subsidy payment rates from the amount parents without subsidies pay



California State Budget FY 2024-25 Governor's May Revision

Governor Newsom released his "May Revise" on May 10, 2024

- Budget Shortfall: \$27.6 B this year; \$28.4 B next year
- Shortfall Plan:
 - Slashes and delays programs
 - Draws down state reserves
 - No plan for new taxes or identifying other sources of revenue

California State Budget FY 2024-25 Governor's May Revision Child Care

Cuts and pauses child care spaces

- Only 119,000 of the 200,000 promised spaces released since 2021
- Rescinds 27,000 previously authorized spaces and delays remaining 54,000 spaces indefinitely, halting 81,000 spaces in total
- Eliminates about 1,700 emergency child care spaces for children in foster care

California State Budget FY 2024-25 Governor's May Revision Child Care

- No new money to fund the alternative methodology for the full cost of care
- No timeline to implement the alternative methodology



California State Preschool & Transitional Kindergarten

- Eliminates previously committed funding for state preschool programs to serve at least 10 percent of children with disabilities
- Maintains Transitional Kindergarten (TK) expansion
- Eliminates funding to support construction and retrofitting of new state preschool, TK, and kindergarten facilities

Cuts and Delays to Other Vital Programs for Children &Families

- Cuts and reduces funding in key CalWORKs Programs
- Delays expansion of CA Food Assistance Program for undocumented individuals over age 55
- Eliminates In-Home Supportive Services for all undocumented individuals
- Eliminates 24/7 hotline for current & former youth in foster care and their caregivers
- Significant cuts to ACES trauma-informed training, outreach, education, and coordination efforts

Policy Bills

- AB 1808 (Nguyen) extends 24-month child care eligibly to CalWORKs child care.
- AB 2381 (Bonta) pays directly contracted child care programs based on the lesser of the maximum reimbursable amount stated in the contract, the net reimbursable program costs, or certified days of enrollment.
- AB 2476 (Bonta) requires state contractors to pay child care providers prior to the day of child care services starting April 30, 2026 and at the maximum subsidy payment rate.
- <u>AB 596</u> (Gómez Reyes) and <u>SB 380</u> (Limón) implement comprehensive rate reform; develop an alternative methodology based on the true cost of care.
- <u>SB 9</u> (Cortese) creates a three-year pilot program in at least three counties to extend foster care services to non-minor dependents up to 22 years old if they are experiencing or at reasonable risk of homelessness.

What's Ahead?

- Legislature Sends State Budget to Governor by June 15
- Governor Signs State Budget by June 30
- State Submits CCDF Final State Plan by July 1
- Contract Negotiations Must Reopen Between Child Care Providers United and the State by this Fall
